Special Veteran Bitch

(10 ½ years old), very feminine type, lovely pretty head, correct bite, good eye colour, good flow of neck into withers, slight drop off over croup and slightly short tail. Lovely type of bitch and still moving well for her age.



Veteran Bitch

7 year old bitch, very pretty head, feminine type, good eye colour, good shoulder, strong topline and tailset, good development through second thigh. Moved very economically and effortlessly for her age. Nicely balanced, well marked, Good type.

Baby Puppy Dog

Three siblings, all very similar in type and obviously related.



Baby puppy dog

1st - Number 3, on this occasion just seemed to be moving out a little better, showing a bit more reach and drive than the second placed dog. Good bone and substance for age. Nice and broad in skull although muzzle a little bit soft but could be due to age, good tailset and width of second thigh. Little bit of ticking coming through which does detract from overall impression..



Baby puppy dog

2nd - Number 4, similar comments in relation to the head, good length of neck and lay of shoulder, good bone, just a bit restricted in front movement and soft in topline. Good tailset and width of second thigh. Again, too much ticking for my taste.

Baby puppy dog

3rd - Number 5, similar comments in relation to head, little bit more narrow in the skull, good colour liver and little bit less ticked than the other two, slightly less angulation and a little bit of a roll over the rump.



Minor puppy

1st - seven months old, beautiful dense black pigment, head a little bit light and muzzle a little bit narrow for my taste, would like to see a little bit more underjaw, good length of neck and moving very economically, little bit straight in shoulder, nice level topline, good width of second thigh, could be lacking a little bit of bone and substance.



Puppy

1st - Aged just one day under 12 months, I really like this dogs size and type, however he's not really enjoying his day today so he's a little bit hesitant and unsure in demeanour. Good width of head and length of muzzle, slightly light in eye colour, nice dark deep pigment, good depth of colour, good bone and substance, nicely balanced front and rear with good muscling and body condition.



Junior

1st - Number 9, attractive stylish looking black dog, good pigment with good depth of colour, evenly marked, good width of skull and length of muzzle, masculine expression, reasonable eye colour, good width of chest and length of neck, slightly straight in shoulder and short in upper arm, good level topline and tailset, good width of second thigh and moved very well. A very showy dog.

Junior

2nd - Number 10, another well balanced dog, good colour liver spotting, good width through skull, good expression. Length of neck adequate, good flow into wither, little bit of a roll over the croup with a slightly dropped tail set, moved well..



Intermediate

1st - .Number 11, really attractive showy dog, very eye catching on the move, good reach and drive with good extension through movement. Good width of skull, muzzle a little short, eye colour possibly a bit light, good flow of neck into wither, good lay of shoulder, good level topline and tailset. Good bone and substance, good width of second thigh with good angles front and rear, tail a little short. Overall, a classy dog presented well.



Intermediate

2nd - Heavily marked liver dog with good quality pigment, nice expression, good eye colour for a liver, could have a bit more stop. Good neck and lay of shoulder, slightly restricted in reach due to slightly short upper arm. Good topline and tailset. Could do with a bit more width of second thigh and rear angulation. Balanced on the move..



Intermediate

3rd - Number 12, really pleasant expression just a little light in eye colour. Adequate length of neck, moved with economy, just not really striding out today and a little short in reach and drive. Good quality coat, good tailset and good muscling. Nice moderate type of dog..

Australian Bred

I thought this was a very strong class, all exhibits nicely balanced and moving well, my first three placings were quite a close race and all a worthy of merit.



Australian Bred

1st - Very showy quality black dog, loved the overall balance and look of this dog. Really nice head planes, good length of muzzle, good eye colour, good length of neck and placement into wither. Good lay of shoulder and length of upper arm, good topline and tailset. Good angulation front and rear and good width of second thigh. Attractively marked and moved well with good reach and drive.



Australian Bred

2nd - Also a very nice type of dog, good quality pigment and spotting, good expression and width of skull, muzzle could be a little longer. A little stuffy through the neck and shoulders, but balanced on the move. Adequate angles which allowed him to move with purpose displaying good reach and drive.



Australian Bred

3rd - Another nicely balanced type of dog, a little heavy through the head and muzzle for my taste, good length of neck and flow into wither, good topline and tailset, nice type on the stack with good balance and good angles. A little bit tired on the move.



Open dog

1st - Number 21, quite a substantial type of dog, nicely balanced, dense liver colour, nice head and expression, good width of skull and length of muzzle, good dark eye for a liver, kind expression. Good shoulder, with good flow from neck into wither and topline. Good length of upper arm, good tidy feet, good width of second thigh, good tailset, moved well with good reach and drive.

Open dog

2nd - Number 23, another showy type of dog, probably a little bit short through length of body for me and shorth through the loin but moved well with good balance. Good neck into shoulder and flow through the wither, good width of chest. Kind expression with good width of skull and length of muzzle. Good tailset and width of second thigh, moved with purpose.



Open dog

3rd - This was a close decision for 2nd and third, \ another quality dog, beaten today as just not quite moving as well a 2nd place getter. A bit straighter through upper arm, good colour liver, with good eye colour, width of skull and length of muzzle, quite a showy dog although i'd like a little bit more substance for an open dog, carried his tail a little bit high.

Dog CC lineup comments

I was really happy with my dog class winners and thought they presented a very competitive line up for the dog CC award. I awarded Dog CC to the Aus Bred class winner, he presents a very elegant outline of good type and well marked. Also very well handled on the day.

Baby Puppy Bitch

1st - One week off 4 months, lovely type of puppy, good bone and substance, good size for her age, lovely front and rear, good neck into wither, good shoulder and length of upper arm, good topline, good feet, good dark eye and pleasant expression. Nice baby.



Minor Puppy Bitch

1st - Number 26, black spotted bitch, good quality pigment with good depth of colour, lovely head, good width of skull and length of muzzle. Eye colour could be a bit darker, good level topline and rear angles, carries her tail a little bit high for my preference.



Minor Puppy Bitch

2nd - Number 27, very over exuberant puppy bitch, very difficult to assess on the move as a little bit distracted today. Pretty head and expression, good width of skull and length of muzzle. Eye colour could be darker, good depth of colour in spotting, little bit straight through the shoulder and short in upper arm, slight drop off over the croup.



Puppy Bitch

1st - Number 28, very pretty liver bitch, nicely decorated with evenly spread spotting. Beautiful elegant length of neck, good topline and tailset. Good angles front and rear and nice width of second thigh. Very promising puppy..

Junior

1st - Number 29, Nice type of bitch, pretty head and expression, good length of neck and flow through to wither, good topline, slight drop off over the croup, good angles front and rear. Spotting a little bit messy.

Intermediate

A really nice class of intermediate bitches.



Intermediate

1st - Number 32, a really classy black bitch, very pretty head and expression, good width of skull and length of muzzle, eye colour adequate. Good length of neck and flow into wither, good level topline and tailset, very balanced on the move, nice type of bitch..



Intermediate

2nd - Number 35, a very showy black bitch, liked the shape and make of this girl, liked the head and expression, good width of skull, length of muzzle, good flow through the wither and into the topline, perhaps a little bit too much condition on which affects her overall balance. Not at her best today having just come into season but moved well.



Intermediate

3rd - This was a close race for 2nd and 3rd, good quality bitch of good type, good depth of colour in her spotting. Mischievous expression, a real twinkle in her eye. Good width of skull and length of muzzle, nicely balanced overall, slight drop off over the croup, economical on the move.

Australian Bred Bitch

1st - Beautiful bitch of good type, good feminine head and expression, good eye colour, good flow of neck into wither, good lay of shoulder and balanced angles front and rear, liked her length to height ratio. Moved with reach and drive, looked like she could go all day.



Australian Bred Bitch

2nd - Good quality black bitch, good depth of pigment to spotting, nicely decorated with evenly spread markings, good expression, width of skull and length of muzzle, lovely type of bitch with good substance and bone. Slight drop over the croup and could be a little short in upper arm, balanced front and rear angles and moved well.



Australian Bred Bitch

3rd - another quality bitch, really nice liver with evenly spread spotting, good expression and eye colour, little bit steep in shoulder and short in upper arm, slight drop off over the croup. Balanced in front and rear angles and moved economically.

Open Bitch class

Very strong class of quality bitches. My first three place getters made for a close race, very classy bitches. All moving really well and placings could change on a different day.



Open Bitch

1st - Beautiful quality liver bitch with evenly spread markings, good width of skull and length of muzzle, good eye colour and pleasing expression, little bit nervy today (could be my raincoat and hat). Nice flow through from neck into wither, good topline and tailset, balanced angulation front and rear, moved really well.

Open Bitch

2nd - Black bitch, very glamorous type, just a little bit longer in body than the first placed bitch which has probably contributed to my decision today for first and second. Also an excellent mover with good angles front and rear. Good head planes, eye colour could be a little light. Good length of neck into wither and good topline and tailset. Good width of second thigh. A little bit straight in shoulder and short in upper arm but balanced front and rear. Coat was a little ticked up which detracted from overall impression. Nicely muscled and well presented. Liked her a lot.



Open Bitch

3rd - another quality bitch, beautiful type with good bone and substance, well up to size, good quality liver markings, nicely decorated. Head could be a little bit strong for a bitch. Nicely balanced angles front and rear, good width of second thigh, could be a little bit long through the loin for me and perhaps a little bit heavy overall but good type.

Best Bitch and CC comments

This was another closely run race, the winner having to work hard to get the nod. Two different types but both really excellent movers and with many features of merit. The winner today just had the edge on overall length to height ratio and length of neck, flow into wither. I just preferred her type slightly more than the reserve CC winner today. The reserve CC winner just moved so well for 5½ and really demanded consideration.

INCOMING & OUTGOING CORRESPONDENCE: Was read. A member has written this letter to be read: I am wanting to make you all aware of a new type of stone that has been found in my male Dalmatian. its called 2,8-dihydroxyadenine uroliths. This is an extremely rare genetic condition that is not usually found in dogs, mainly humans. Both parents have to carry the gene, but carriers will never show symptoms. It can't really be treated with medication and does not dissolve in either a acidic or alkaline environment. He needs to be fed a low purine diet and will be a 'gunni pig' on what happens. The researchers believe that many cases of stones in dogs are misdiagnosed as this is not tested for due to its rarity, It is a different colour to the other 2 types of bladder stones. You can have your dogs DNA tested to see if they carry the gene.

I am currently working with his Breeder and the Minnesota Urolith Center and sending samples of urine and DNA, also that of his parents and some siblings so as we can understand this condition more. To the knowledge of the researchers at the Minnesota Urolith Center, it has never been found in a Dalmatian. I will keep you updated on the process and if there is any recommended treatment once the samples have been tested. (aussie vets and specialists are baffled by this, and as yet I have found no Australian interest in helping me, thus my own research with the Minnesota Urolith Center)
